*(A well-made, delicate white wine with plenty of fruit. This company has led the way with modern Spanish wine making).*

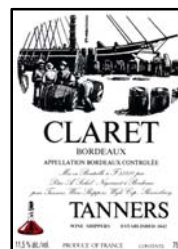

## CHAMPAGNES AND SPARKLING WINES

The Champagne region of France lies to the east of Paris, in the Marne Valley. The vineyards are strictly defined by French law and are found mostly south of Rheims, around Epernay. Surprisingly, Champagne can be made from red as well as white grapes. This famous sparkling wine is ideal for celebrations. Each House produces a wine with a style and character of its own. A delicious alternative to Champagne, sparkling wines are made by a variety of methods - Méthode Traditionnelle being the best, of course, as it follows the same process as that for Champagne. Sparkling wines may come from any part of the wine-producing world, but may not be called Champagne.

Organic Wines (denoted by the symbol **O**) are made from organically grown grapes, i.e. grapes grown without the application of synthetic fertilisers, pesticides and other chemical sprays. Also intervention in the winery tends to be less than with some other wines and reduced levels of sulphur are used.

Environmentally Friendly Wines (denoted by the symbol ) is a bit of a "catch all" phrase that we use to describe producers who are not certified organic but still employ many of the same practices both in the vineyard and the winery. These producers tend to consider themselves organic by inclination but tempered by pragmatism
